Our Curriculum

This year we are using the Illustrated Ministry, recommended by the Washington Dioscean. The Illustrated Ministry fosters authentic faith engagement with refreshing designs, creative activities, and an intergenerational focus.

Our first series, *An Illustrated Compassion: Learning to Love Like God,* will walk participants through twelve stories (six from the Hebrew Scriptures and six from the New Testament) that all focus on the theme of compassion.

An Illustrated Compassion turns to scripture and looks for examples of God's compassion throughout the Bible, and also asks what it might look like for all of us to lead more compassionate lives.

Module 1 - Compassion in the Hebrew Scriptures

- Genesis 18:1-8: Abraham and Sarah's Guests
- Exodus 1:15-21: Shiphrah and Puah's Courage

- 2 Samuel 9:1-13: David Shows Kindness
- 2 Kings 6:8-23: The Feast that Brought Peace

Module 2 - Compassion in the New Testament

- Matthew 9:35-38: Jesus' Compassion
- Mark 10:17-27: The One Thing
- Luke 7:11-17: Compassion that Heals
- John 5:1-9: Jesus Heals on the Sabbath

Module 3 - Living a Compassionate Life

- Deuteronomy 10:12-22: You Were Immigrants
- Micah 6:6-8: What is Good
- Matthew 25:31-46: Lord, When Was It?
- Luke 10:25–37: The One Who Showed Mercy

Sunday School Policies

** If your child needs you at any time during the service, you will receive a text message on your cell phone. Please keep your phone on vibrate during the service ***

Wellness

- As of August 2021, all people ages 2 and up, regardless of vaccination status, will be required to wear a mask at all times while attending Sunday School. If the county/CDC revises their policy, we will revisit this at that time. Additionally, children will be grouped by family and assigned seating 3-6 feet apart.
- 2. If your child has been exposed or in close contact with anyone diagnosed with Covid 19 or placed in quarantine for possible exposure to Covid 19 within the last two weeks, we ask that you refrain from attending Sunday School.

- 3. If your child (or anyone in their household) is experiencing the following symptoms associated with Covid 19, we ask that you refrain from attending Sunday School for two weeks
 - Fever over 100 degrees
 - Loss of taste or smell
 - Cough
 - Muscle Aches
 - Sore Throat

- Congestion or Runny Nose
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or loss of appetite
- 4. Children must be symptom free from the following without medication for a FULL 24 hours before entering the classroom:
 - Fever of 100 or higher
 - Cough/Congestion
 - Vomiting or diarrhea
 - Conjunctivitis (pink eye or other eye infection)
 - Contagious Rash
 - Open sores

- Excessive Nasal drainage
- Green/ Yellow drainage
- Sore throat
- Cold
- Flu
- Lice
- 5. If a child is displaying any of these symptoms prior to entering the classroom OR If a child develops any of these symptoms while in class, the parent/guardian will be contacted to pick up the child.

Injury and First Aid

1. We can administer only Band-Aids and Ice Packs. If your child has an accident you will be contacted (so you can decide if you need to pick up your child).

Restrooms and Diapering

- 1. Parents are encouraged to take their toilet-trained child to the restroom prior to the start of church.
- 2. Children who are toilet trained are to be able to use the restroom completely independently. If they need help or have an accident, a parent/guardian will be called to assist.
- 3. Only parents/guardians may change children who are in pull-ups, and/or diapers. If your child needs to be changed we will call you to assist.
