

Emmanuel: God With Us A Hymn Festival for Advent December 10, 2023

About Today's Liturgy

Today's service is based on the Great O Antiphons of Advent. Dating back to the 8th century or earlier, the O Antiphons preceded the Magnificat during each of the seven days leading up to Christmas Eve. The O Antiphons were later translated and paraphrased to become the beloved Advent hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel."

You will hear each O antiphon sung in the original Latin followed by the corresponding verse of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." Next, the scriptural reference for each antiphon will be read, followed by a Christmas carol representing the fulfillment of the prophecies expressed in the reading. The first letters of the antiphon titles (Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia) create the Latin acrostic *Ero Cras*, meaning "tomorrow I shall be (there)."

Thank you for joining us as we eagerly await the coming of Emmanuel, God with us.

Cantor:

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Officiant: You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands.

-Isaiah 55:12-13

People: Gracious God, you came to us in human flesh, and you abide with us in the Holy Spirit. Fill us with your joy, and help us shine as a light to the world. Through Jesus Christ, who makes our joy complete. Amen.

The Bidding Prayer (Please remain standing)

Officiant: Beloved in Christ, as we await the great festival of Christmas, let us prepare ourselves so that we may be shown its true meaning. Let us hear, in lessons from Holy Scripture, how the prophets of Israel foretold that God would visit and redeem the waiting people. Let us rejoice, in our carols and hymns, that the good purpose of God is being mightily fulfilled.

Let us celebrate the promise that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, will bring all people and all things into the glory of God's eternal kingdom. The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the poor hear and see the Gospel. First, let us pray for the world God so loves, for those who have not heard the good news of God, or who do not believe it; for those who walk in darkness and in the shadow of death; and for the Church in this and every place, that it may be freed from all evil and fear, and may in pure joy lift up the light of the love of God. These prayers and praises let us humbly offer to God, in the words that Christ himself taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen. Officiant: May the Lord, when he comes, find us watching and waiting, now and at all times. Amen.

O Adonai, and Leader of the House of Israel, Who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush And gave him the law on Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

O come, O come, thou Lord of might, Who to thy tribes on Sinai's height In ancient times didst give the law, In cloud, and majesty, and awe. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Lesson: Isaiah 11:4-5, 33:32

O Come, thou Branch of Jesse's tree, Free them from Satan's tyranny; That trust thy mighty power to save, And give them victory o'er the grave. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Lesson: *Isaiah 11:1, 11:10; 52:15* **Lois Leigh** A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.

On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

So he shall startle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which had not been told them they shall see, and that which they had not heard they shall contemplate.

Antiphon 4

O Key of David and Scepter of the House of Israel; You open and no one can shut; You shut and no one can open: Come and lead the prisoners from the prison-house, Those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

O Come, thou Key of David, come, And open wide our heavenly home; Make safe the way that leads on high, And close the path to misery. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Lesson: *Isaiah 22:22; 9:7; 42:6-7* **Janie Heppel** I will place on his shoulder the key of the house of David; he shall open, and no one shall shut; he shall shut, and no one shall open.

His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace, for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

Antiphon 5 O Morning Star [Rising Sun, Dayspring], Splendor of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness And the shadow of death.

O Come, thou Dayspring from on high, And cheer us by thy drawing nigh; Disperse the gloomy clouds of night, And death's dark shadow put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Lesson: *Isaiah 9:2; 60:1-2; Malachi 4:2* Nancy Osgood The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you.

But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall.
